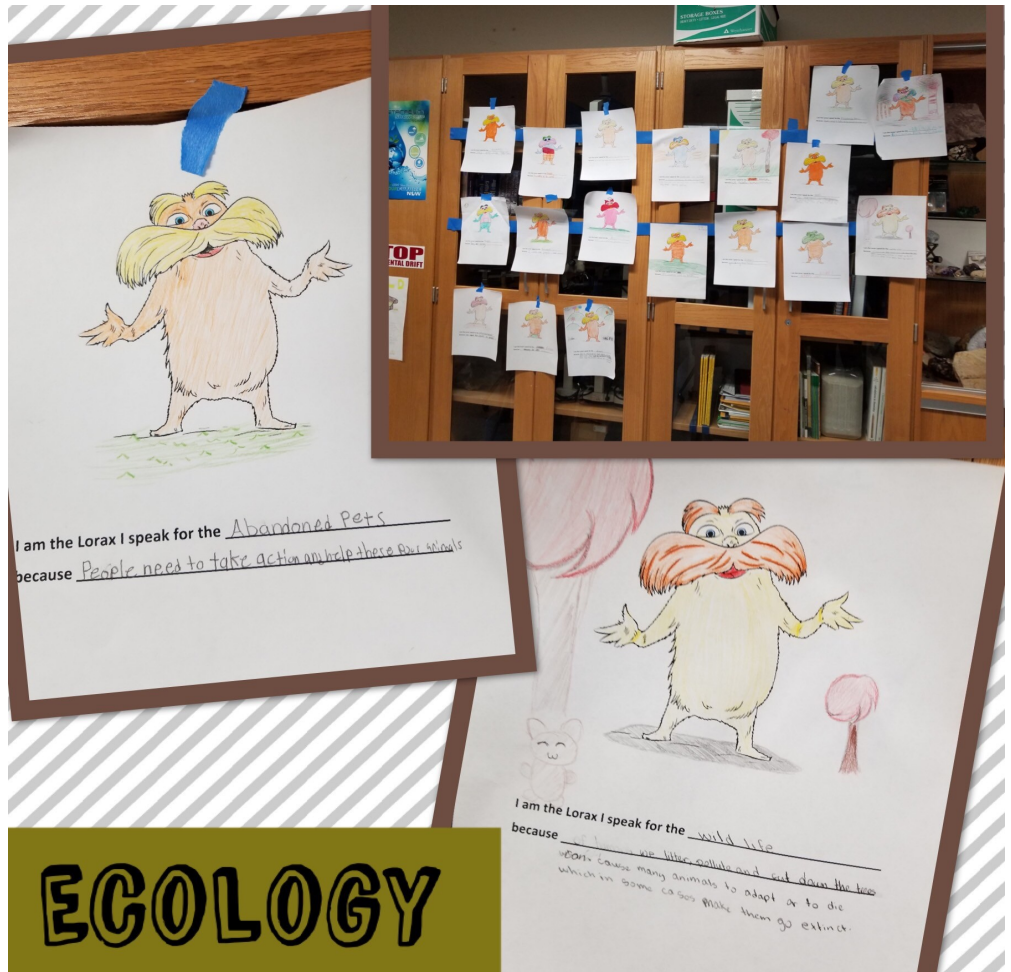
SATURDAY ACADEMY

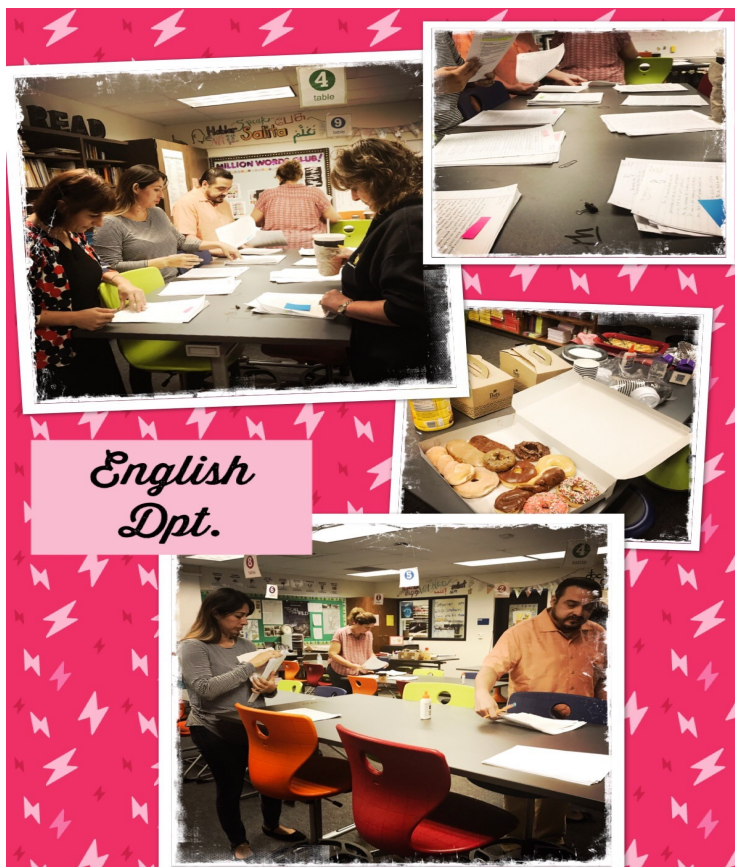
Drama gets ready for A Christmas Carol
