CIVIC LEARNING

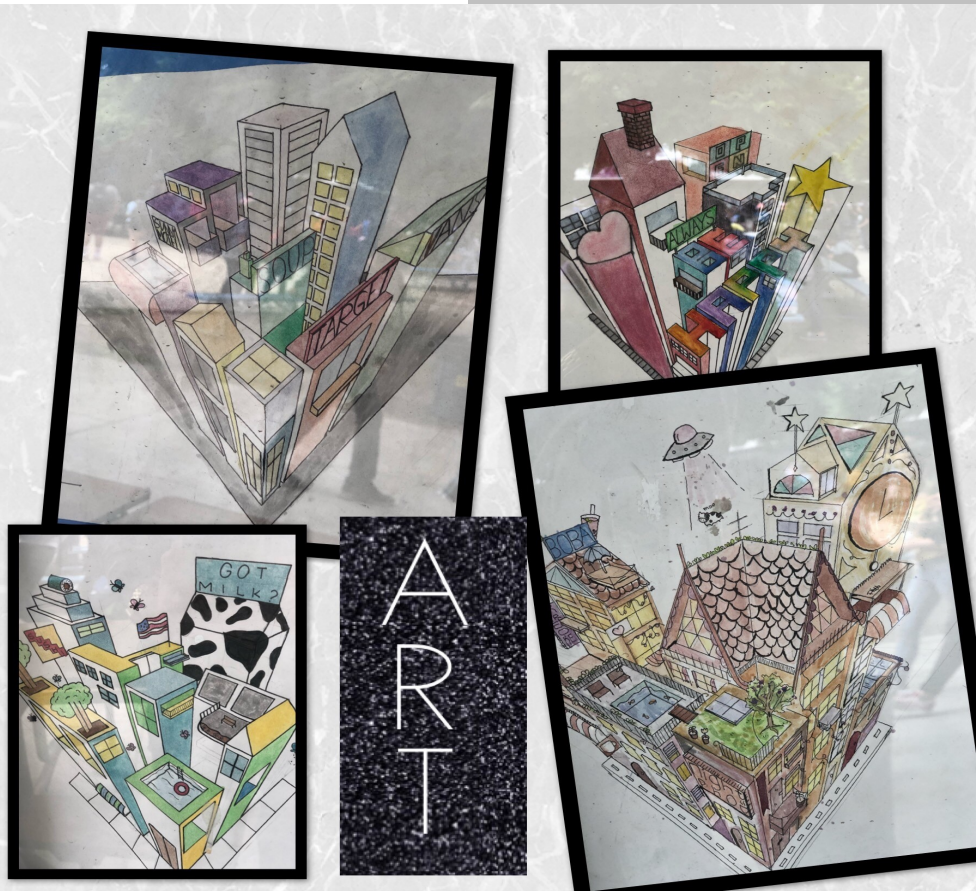

Benefits of X-Country Unit: School wide events create community. Students were excited and cheered each other on in a positive and safe atmosphere for all.

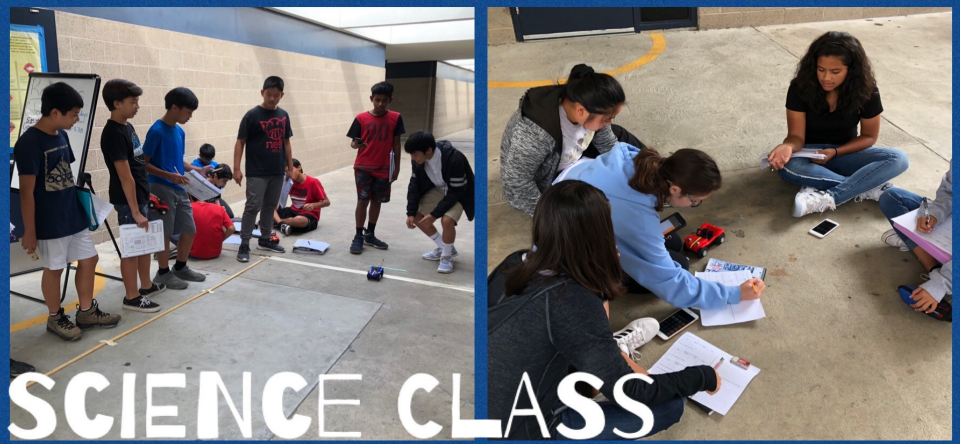

APE Class was able to join us and all students had a great time.

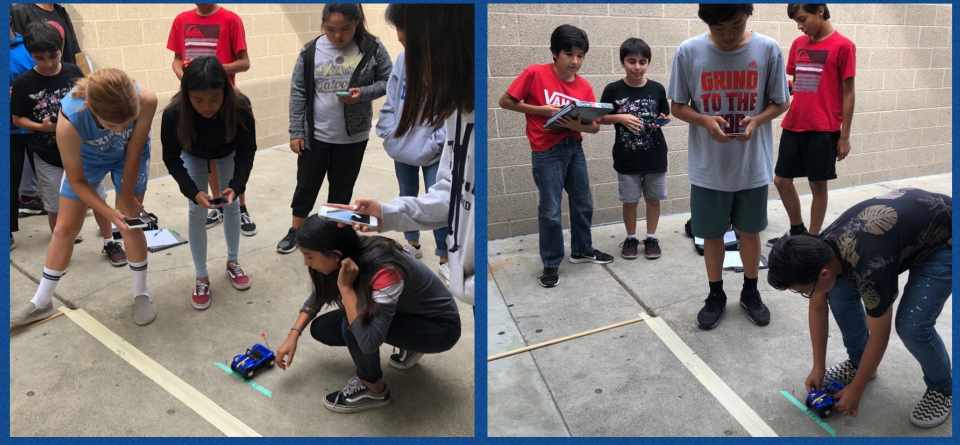
Each Quarter PE classes will look forward to a fun event where they get to work hard and are rewarded for their efforts.

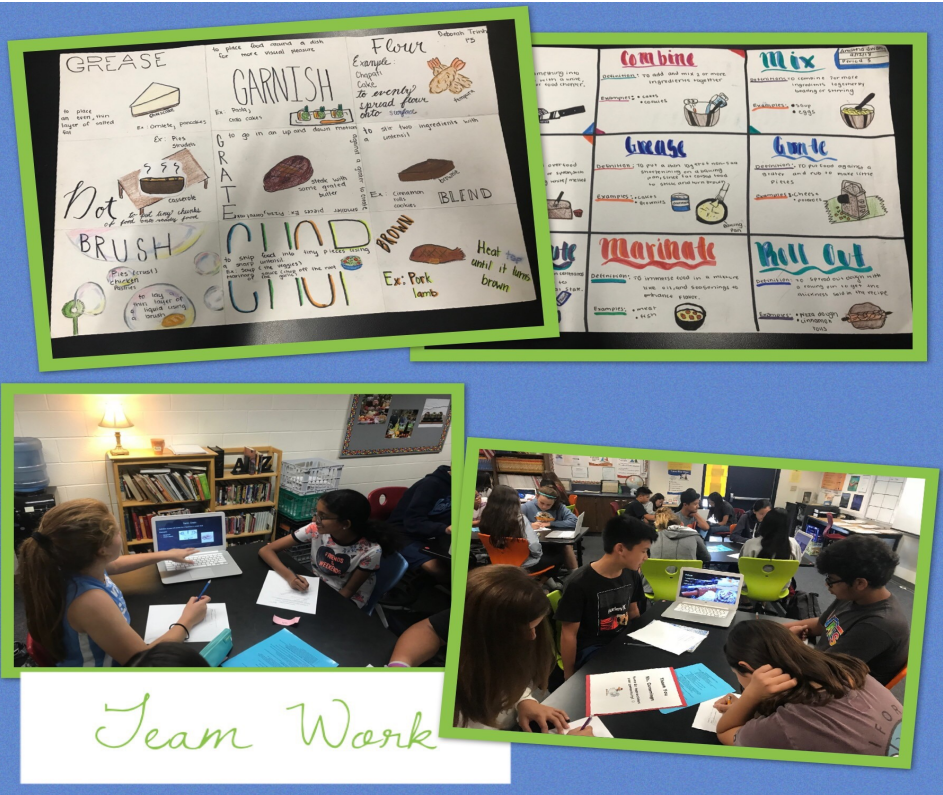
PE LESSON SHARES
