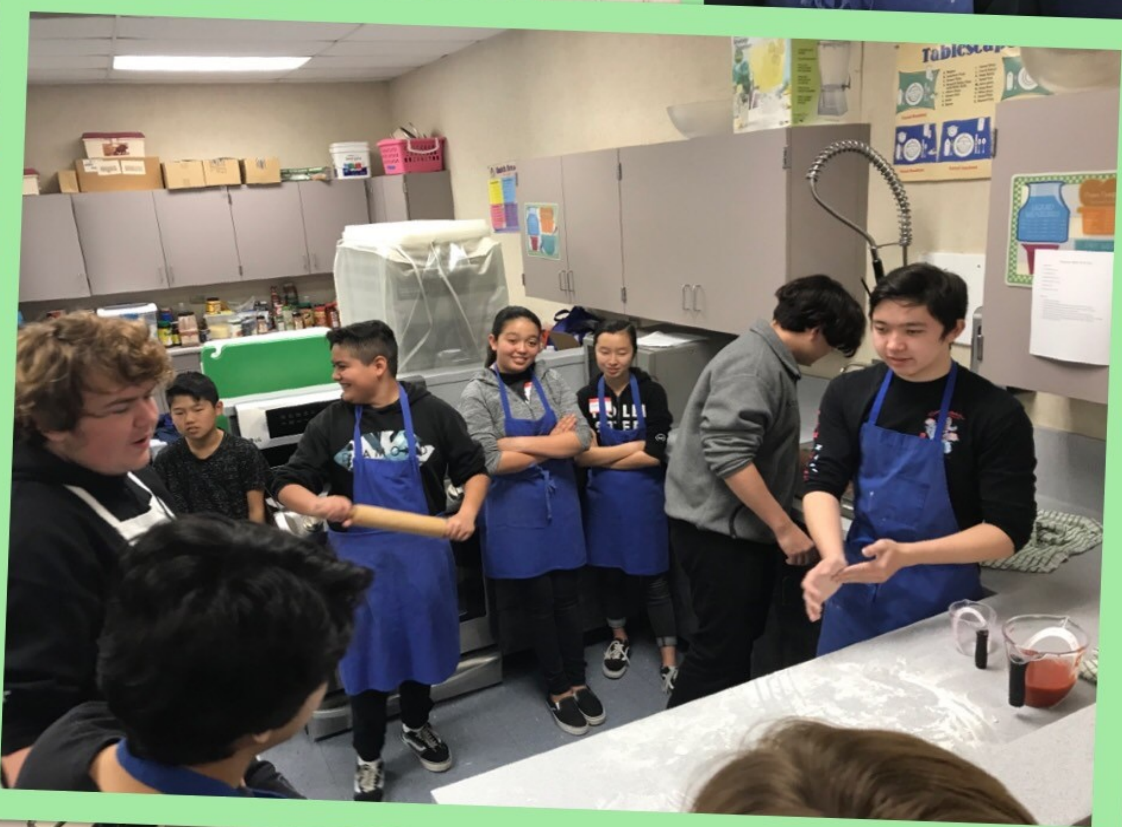
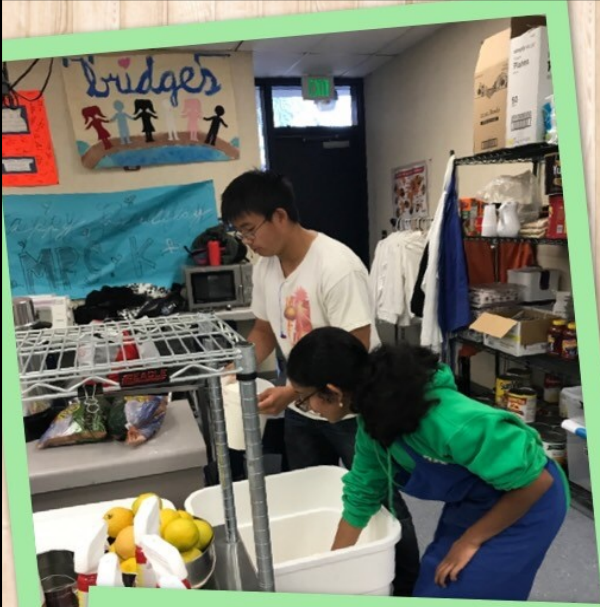


HOME EC

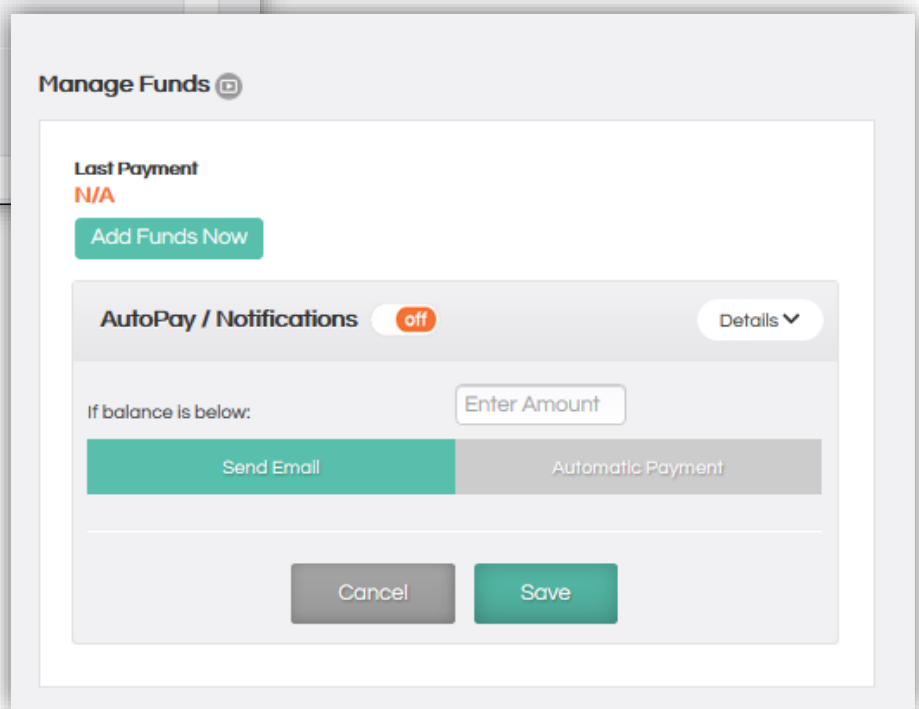
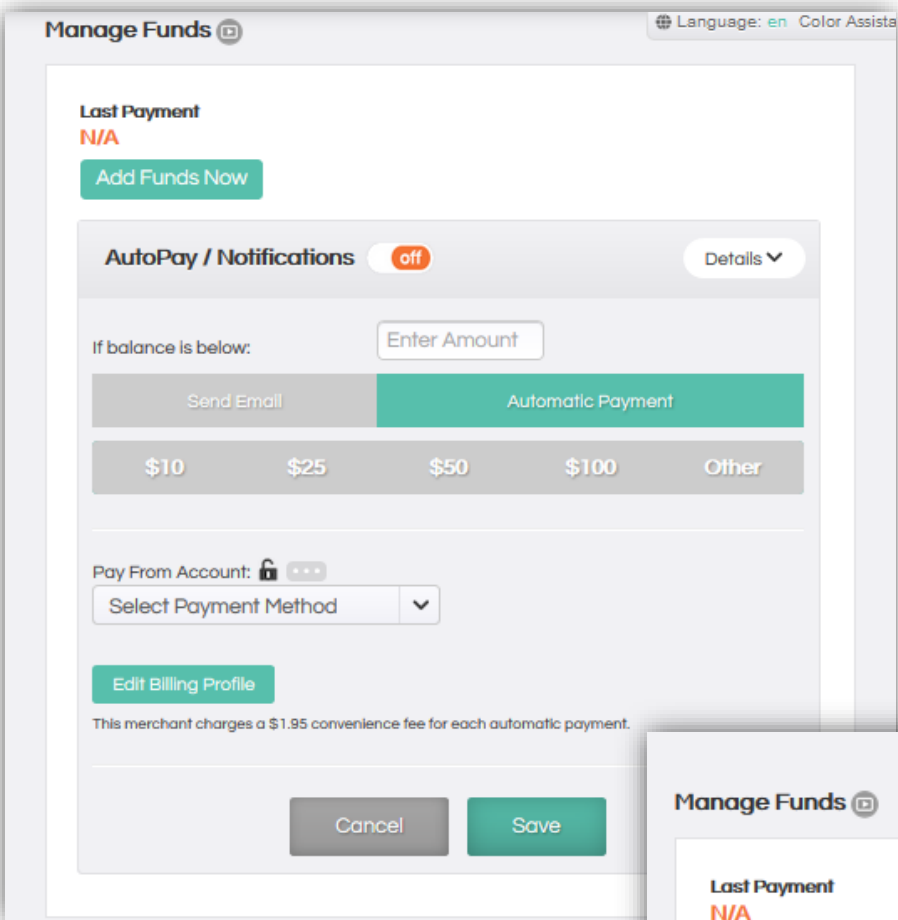

School Pay

Parents certainly have the ability to be notified when their student's balance falls below a certain amount. This can be done by following the instructions below.

- Log in to SchoolPay
- Hover over Payments
- Select Food Services from the drop down menu
- Click Details next to AutoPay/Notifications
- Turn Notifications on

Here, the parent has the option to receive an email when their student's balance falls below a certain amount, or set up for the balance to be replenished automatically when the balance falls below a certain amount.
