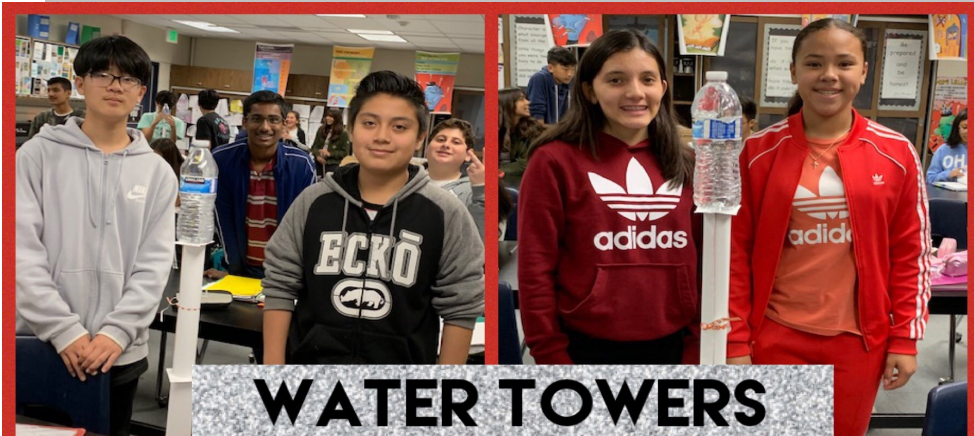
## LOST AND FOUND ITEMS

That's right only 2 pieces of paper...no tape...no glue.

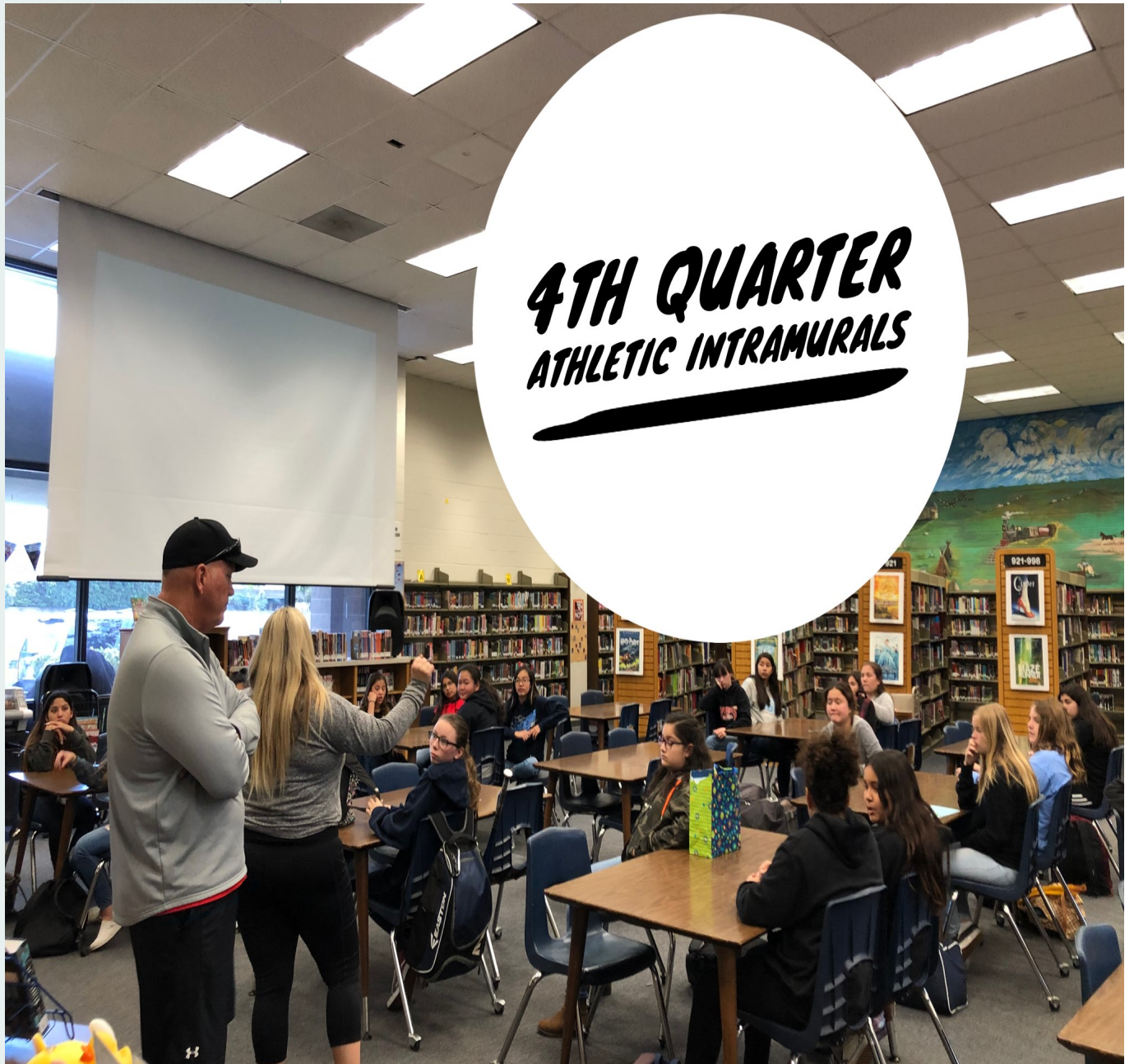

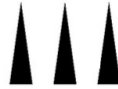
