Language Barriers


Some students at Lexington are just learning English. There are many different languages spoken at Lexington, at my old school it was mostly just English and Spanish






Fall Sports and PE






It has come to my attention that "smart" watches (ie apple watches, etc) are beginning to become an issue on campus. I want to remind everyone that all electronic devices are not permitted to be in use during school hours. We have recently discovered some students storing answers on them for tests.





TIGER WOODS LEARNING LAB
