It was funny to me how my worries and realities from 5,000 miles away were the same. Education at the core is altruistic and selfless---and it can bring commonalities and understanding when you might think you are so different. Kids are kids, Parents are parents, and Teachers are teachers---no matter in a small village outside HoChi Minh City Vietnam or in this small little city of Cypress. We have so much to be thankful for. I am grateful for this village and my tribe here at Lexington-Thank you and I hope you have an amazing Thanksgiving Holiday!

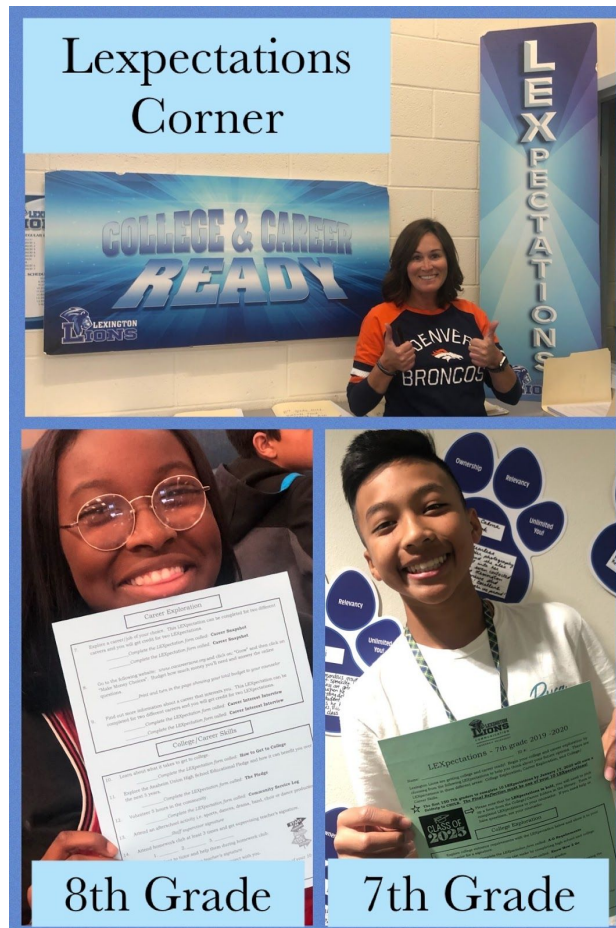

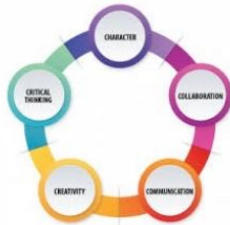
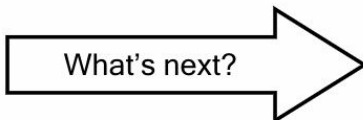

And the Band Played On

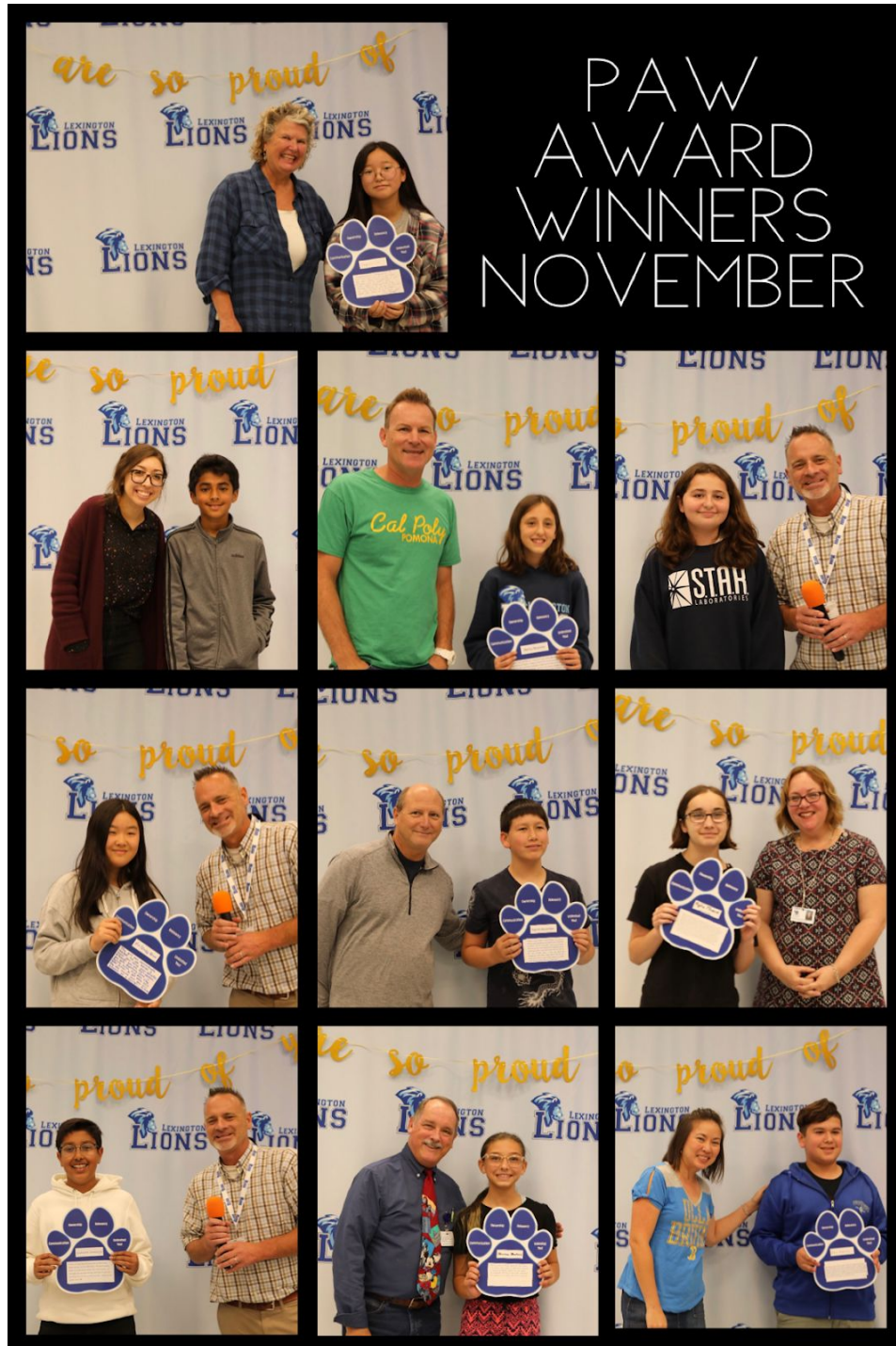

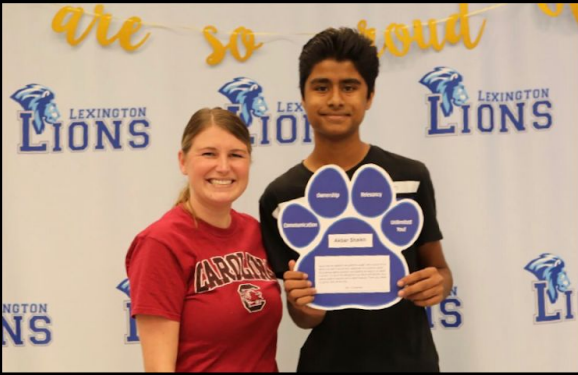


Lion Paw Awards

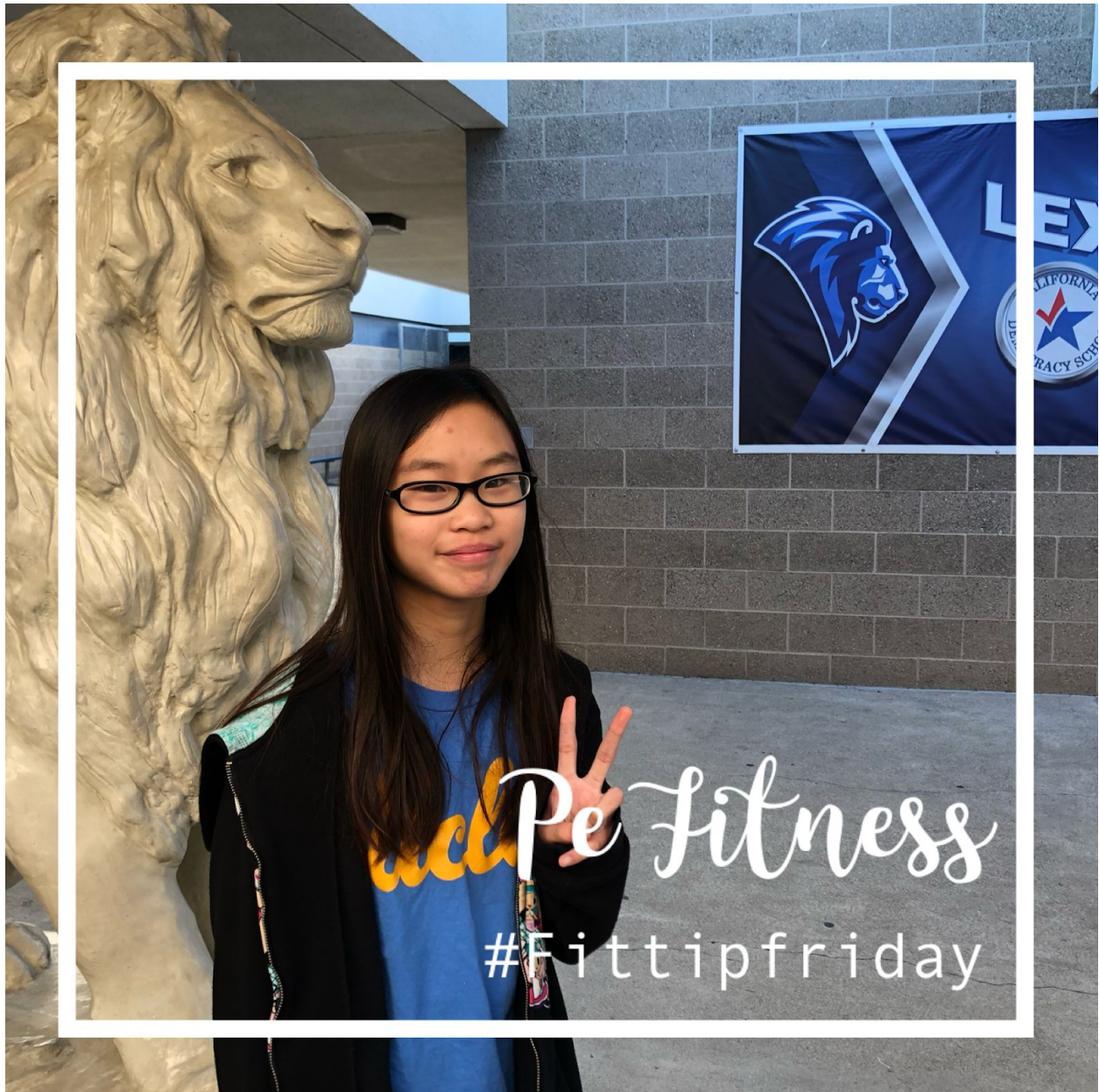
Photo Gets Thankful

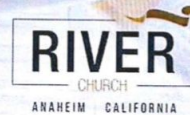

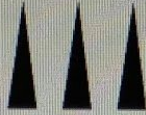

- Achieve more regardless of ethnic and/or racial background, socioeconomic status, or parent education level.
- Achieve better grades, test scores, and attendance
- Consistently complete homework
- Have better self-esteem, are more self-disciplined, and show higher aspirations and motivation towards school
- More likely to graduate and go onto higher education

How Can YOU Become Involved?

1. Provide Support and leadership through active engagement in your child's education.
2. Work collaboratively with your school's administration, teachers and your Family & Community Engagement Specialist to learn about all aspects of the school's structure and share this information with other parents.
