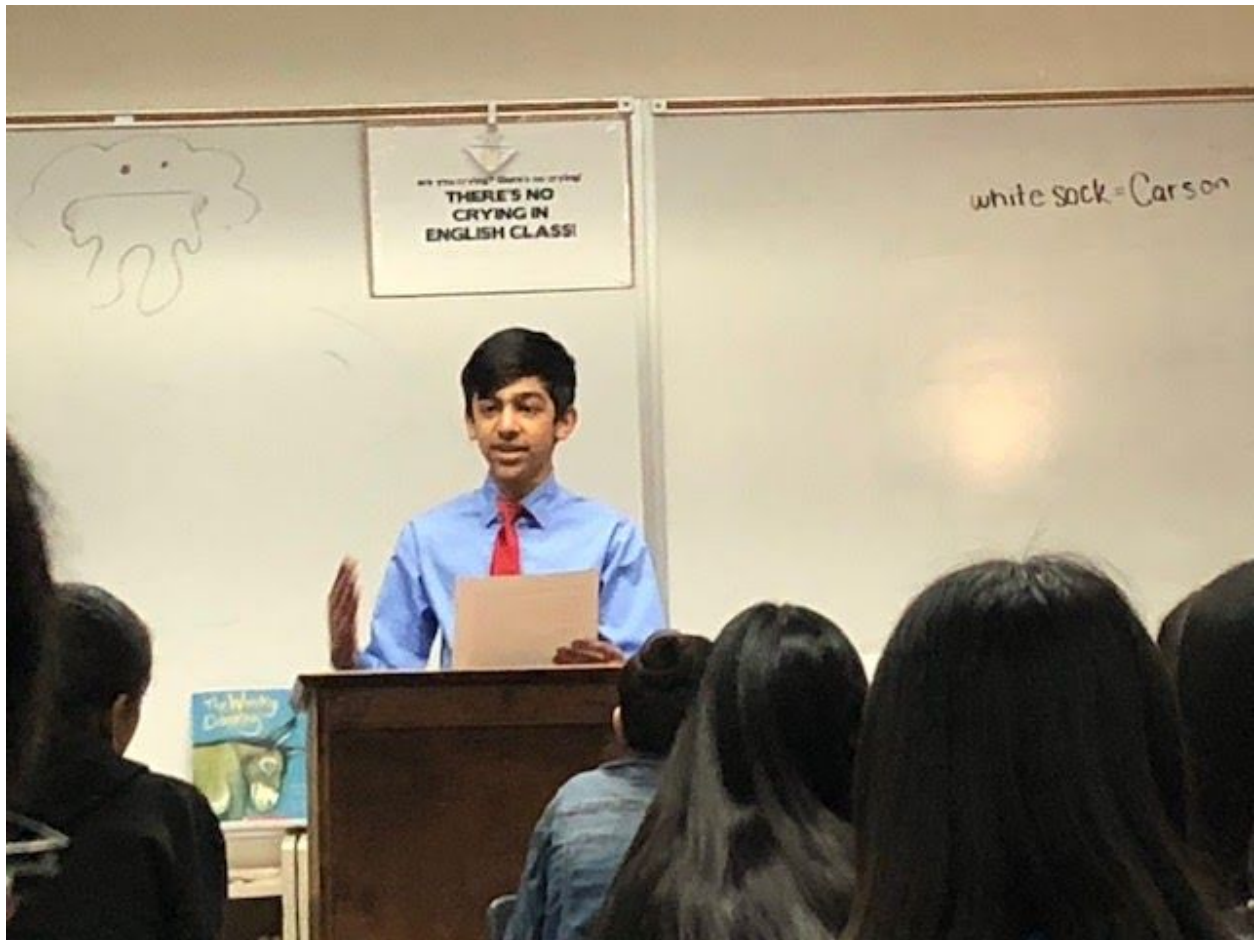

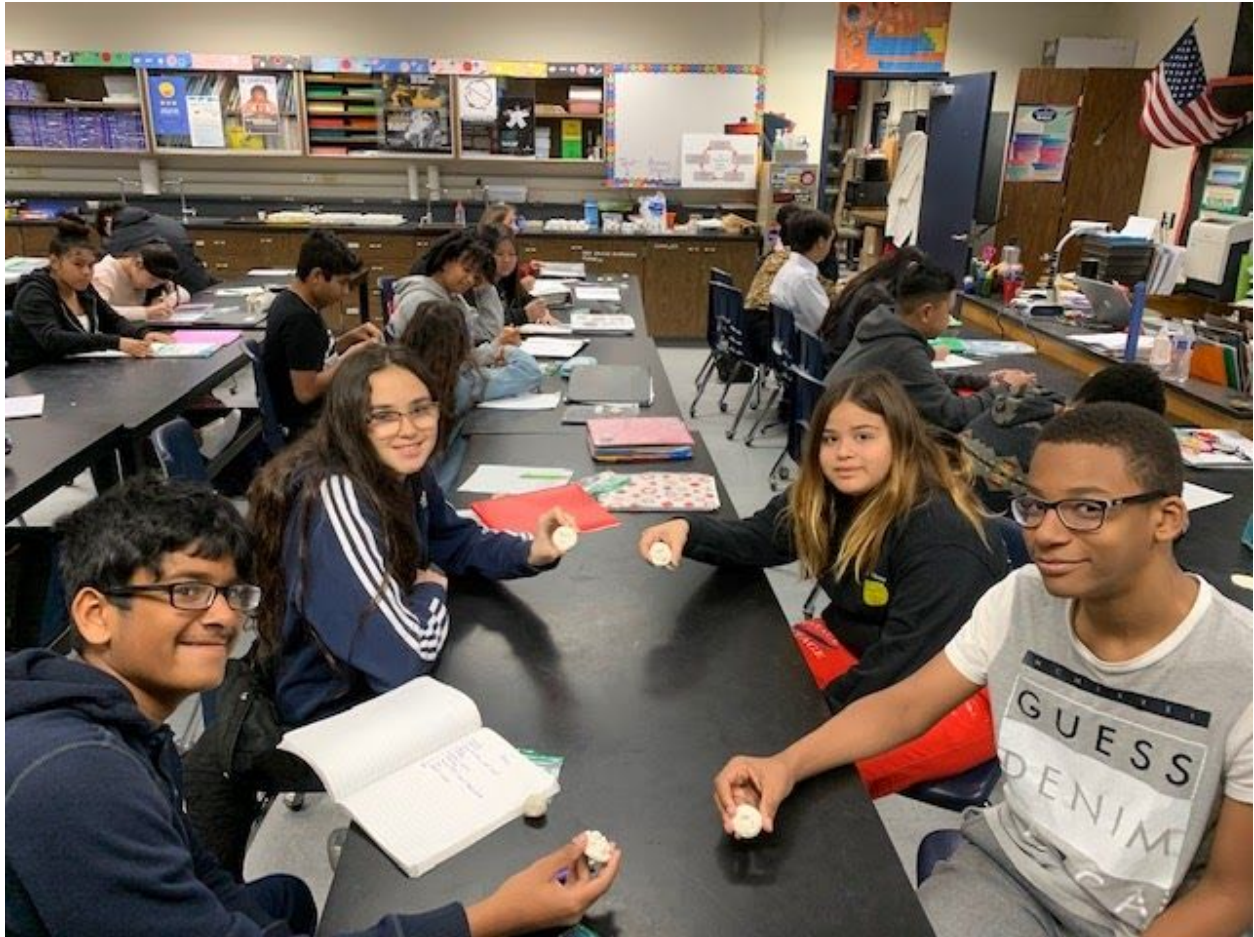


Science Rocks

Orange County Peer Court

April 08, 2020

Peer Court involves an innovative jury process through which teenage students – ages 11 to 17 – recommend sanctions for first-time juvenile offenders. About 240 minors appear before Peer Court juries each year. Members of the jury pool (participate as a juror) may earn up to two hours of community service.


Operating under the authority of the County of Orange Probation Department, Orange County judges preside over the sessions and select student juries from the audience. The jurors ask questions of the juvenile offender and parent(s), deliberate with the assistance of an attorney advisor and recommend sanctions to the Court to help get the minor back on the right track. The Judge issues the final decision on sanctions with the Probation Department supervising completion of the court-ordered sentence.

How: Just show up and plan to stay the entire time. You may not leave early. Some history classes give extra credit. See your teacher for requirements.

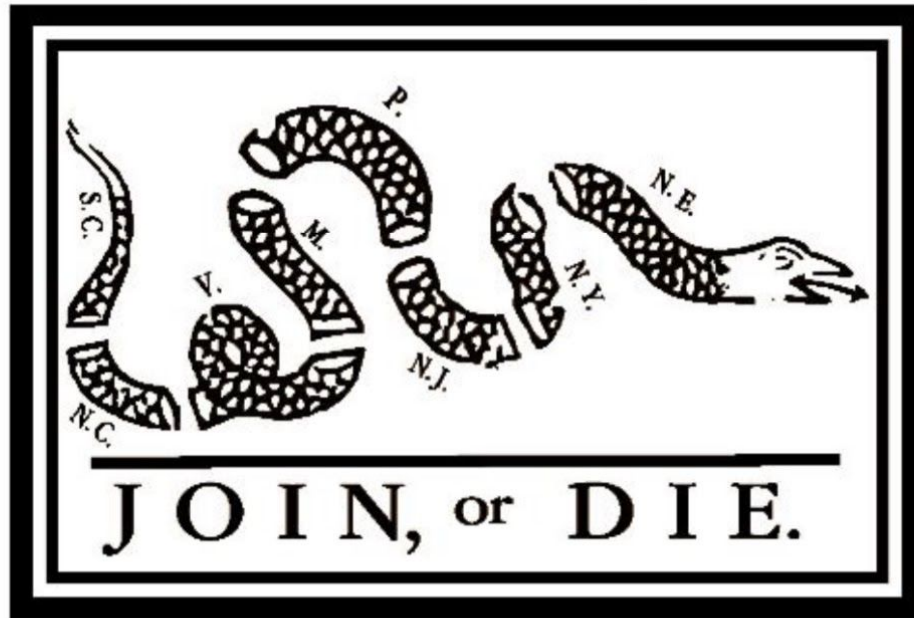

TikTok is a video-sharing social media app available on iOS and Android which lets users create, share, and view user created videos much in a similar manner to Facebook, Instagram and Snapchat. It's main draw, however, is that users can record and upload bite-sized looping videos of themselves lip-synching and dancing to popular music or soundbites, often for comedic effect, which can then be further enhanced with filters, emojis and stickers. TikTok has been designed with the young user in mind and has a very addictive appeal. At the beginning of 2019 it skyrocketed in popularity to become the iOS store's most downloaded app with over 33 million downloads. Estimates suggest that it now has anything between 500 million and over 1 billion monthly active users worldwide.

What parents need to know about TIKTOK

<p>MATURE CONTENT</p> <p>On the iOS store, TikTok is listed as 12+. On the Google Play Store it is rated as 'Parental guidance recommended'. When signing up for the app, it's possible to be about your age without any form of verification. As children scroll through their feed, most of the videos they're likely to come across are light-hearted or funny takes on dance routines which are designed to make people laugh. However there has been a slew of videos which have been reported for featuring drug and alcohol abuse, self-harm and sexual content, including young teens dressing overly sexually and behaving suggestively. Given the deluge of material uploaded to TikTok every day, it's impossible to moderate everything and it can be quite common to come across explicit content on the 'for you' feed when logging into the platform.</p>	<p>INAPPROPRIATE MUSIC</p> <p>TikTok revolves around creating music videos through lip-synching and dancing. Inevitably, some of the music featured by users will contain explicit or suggestive lyrics. Given the undeniably young user base, there is a risk that children may look to imitate the explicit language they hear or the suggestive actions they see when viewing others user's videos on the app.</p>	<p>TIKTOK FAME</p> <p>TikTok is very image focused and there is a notable preoccupation with appearing cool and attractive. Many teenagers now attempt to go viral and become what's known in-app as 'TIKTOK famous'. TikTok (and its predecessor musical.ly) has spawned its own celebrities - social media stars Loren Gray and Jacob Sartorius have been catapulted to fame through their initial exposure on the app. Obviously, most budding influencers looking to become the next big thing will be disappointed, but this may have the knock-on effect of making them go to more and more drastic lengths to get noticed.</p>
<p>ONLINE PREDATORS</p> <p>As a social network, TikTok makes it easy to connect with other users. This includes the ability to comment on and react to other user's videos, follow their profile and download their content. Be aware that by default, any user can comment on your child's video if their account is set to public. Most interactions are harmless enough but as an app, TikTok is prone to predators because of the abundance of younger users.</p>	<p>ADDICTIVE NATURE</p> <p>Social media is designed to be addictive and TikTok is no different. It can be fun and hugely entertaining. However, it is also because of this that it can be hard to put down. In addition to the short, punchy nature of the looping video format, the app's ability to keep you guessing what will come on screen next makes it easy to turn a five-minute visit into 45-minute visit.</p>	<p>IN-APP PURCHASES</p> <p>Aside from the content, there's also the option to purchase in-app extras called 'TIKTOK coins'. Prices range from £0.99 for 100 coins to an eye-watering £93.99 for 18,000 coins. TIKTOK coins are used to purchase different emotes to reward content creators that a user finds funny or entertaining. In the iOS version of the app you can disable the option to buy TIKTOK coins but this sadly doesn't seem to be a feature in the Android version.</p>

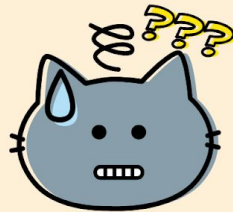
National Online Safety #WakeUpWednesday Safety Tips For Parents

<p>TALK ABOUT ONLINE DANGERS</p> <p>Assuming your child is above the age limit to use the app, make sure you also take the time to talk to them about what they are seeing on the app. Name as dangers, get them to give you their opinion on what is appropriate and remind them to report anything that seems off. Go over what they shouldn't do about the app. Give them the chance to ask you any questions and be positive and understanding of them. In the long run, getting them to think critically about what they're seeing gives a long way to keeping them social media savvy.</p>	<p>USE PRIVACY SETTINGS</p> <p>Undoubtedly, the easiest way to safeguard your child on TikTok is to make sure their account is set to private. This means only those users your child approves can view, like, and follow their content. Setting the account to private may clash with your child's goal of making music superstars, but it will keep their account secure from strangers. This setting can be enabled under the privacy and safety menu by pressing the settings in the top left of the app. To be extra safe, there are additional controls available to toggle such as who can send comments and messages, among other options.</p>	<p>ENABLE RESTRICTED MODE</p> <p>In the digital wellbeing section there's the ability to turn on restricted mode using a PIN. Restricted mode filters out content that is not age appropriate although it should be noted that this isn't always 100% fool proof. When enabling restricted mode, parents should still be vigilant to what their child is watching and take note that the algorithm moderating content is not infallible.</p>
<p>EXPLORE AND LEARN YOURSELF</p> <p>Understanding and learning the app yourself is a great way to get to grips with TIKTOK. You could then use this knowledge with your child and watch some videos with them. If you are the parent of a teen, even if it does not make you popular, being a close eye on what they're viewing and sharing. That said, it's a brilliant chance to turn it into a bonding opportunity with your child also. You could even mention some lesser performer and make videos with them which (more importantly) keeping them safe online.</p>	<p>LEARN HOW TO REPORT AND BLOCK INAPPROPRIATE CONTENT</p> <p>With the proper privacy settings in place, TIKTOK can be a safe space for your child to express themselves. However, just in case something does manage to slip through, make sure your child knows how to report and report content that isn't appropriate and get them to come to you about what they have seen. TIKTOK allows users to report offensive and comments within the app. You can also block individual users by going on their profile.</p>	<p>MODERATE SCREEN TIME</p> <p>As entertaining as TIKTOK is, you can help your child moderate their time on the app by making use of the digital wellbeing section. Under the screen time management option, you can limit the daily allotted time on the app to increments ranging from 30 to 120 minutes. You can also lock this preference behind a PIN number which has to be entered in order to then remove the daily time limit. This way your child can get their daily dose of memes without wasting every the day.</p>

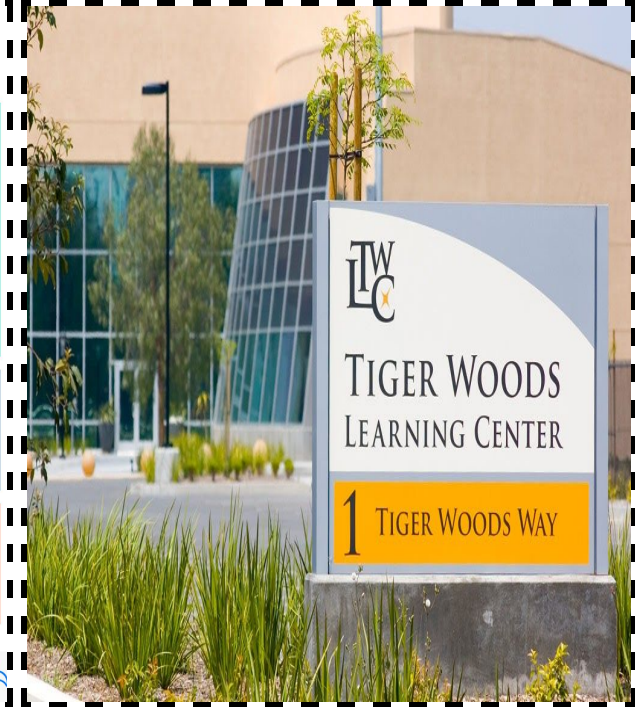

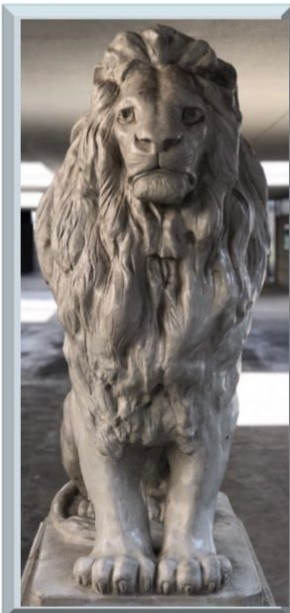
