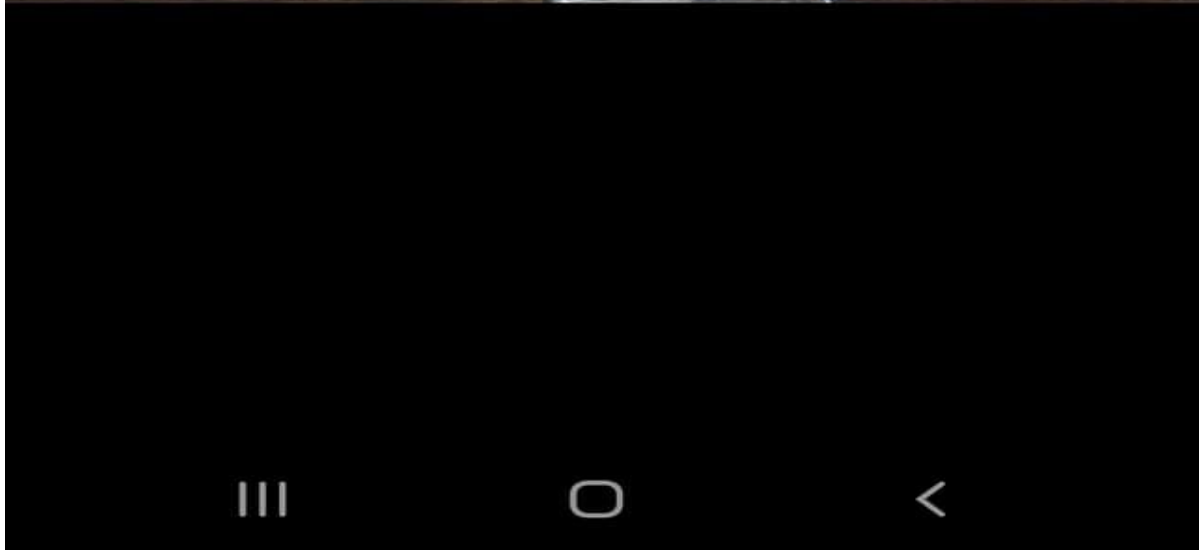
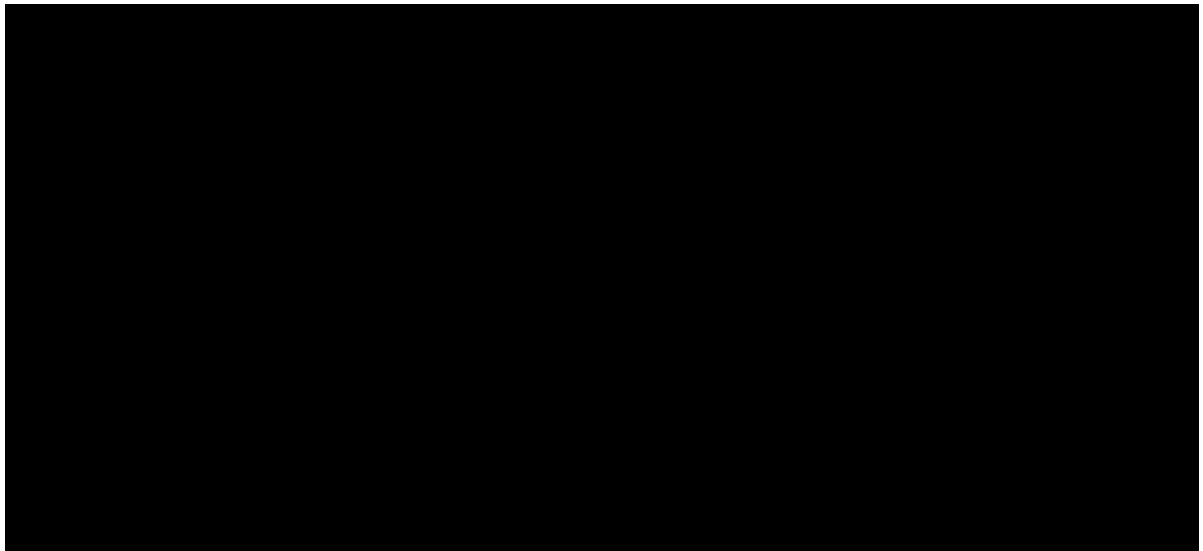






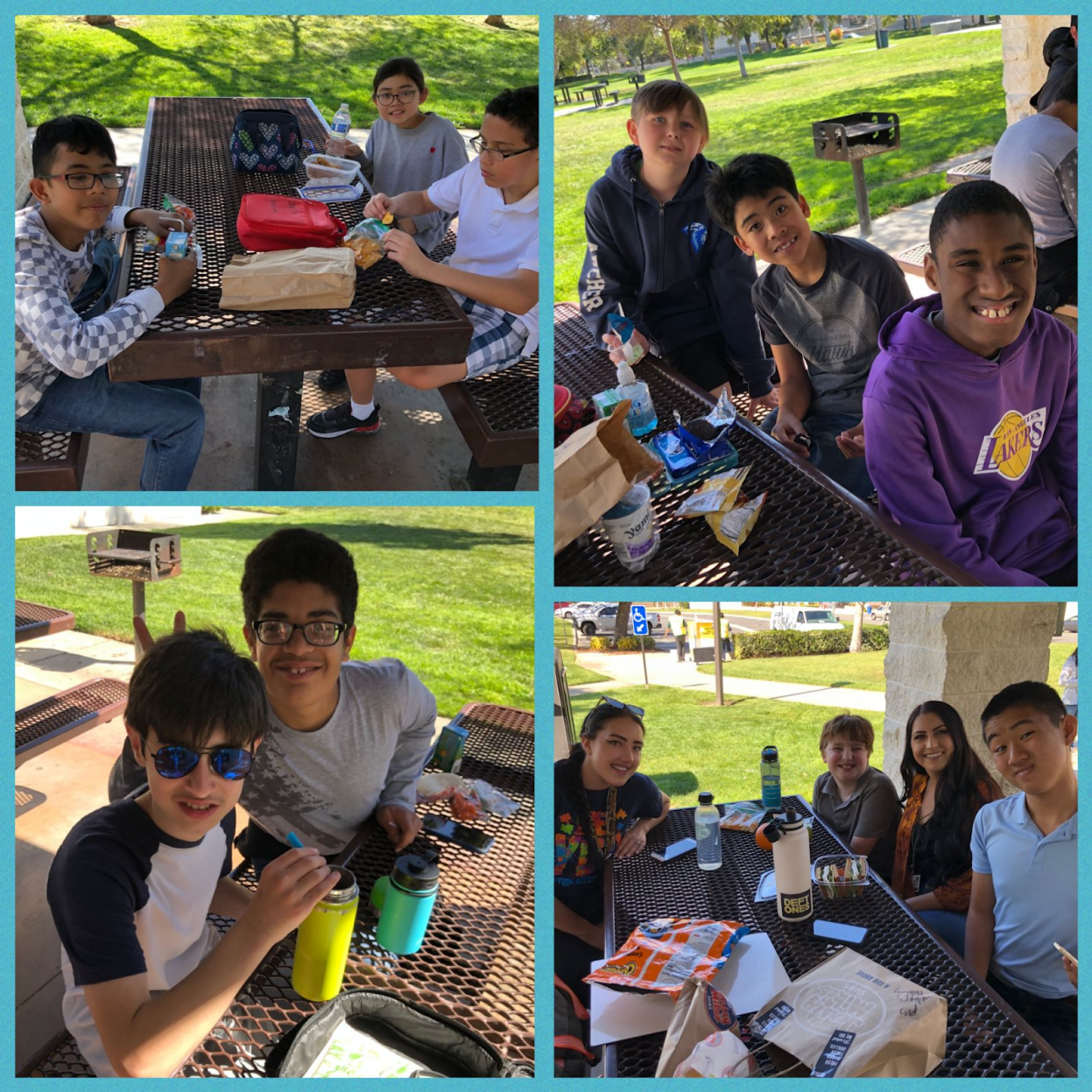






Community Based Instruction

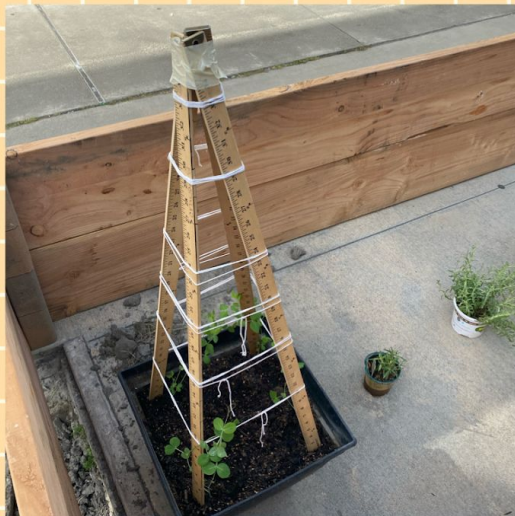
ASB Interviews

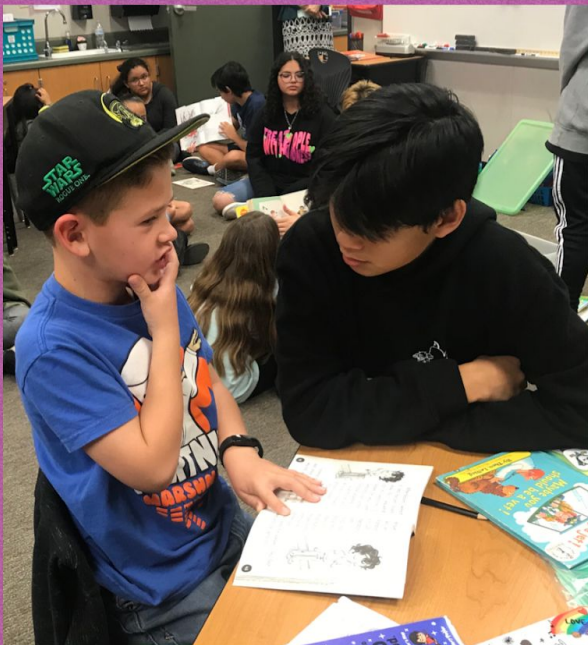
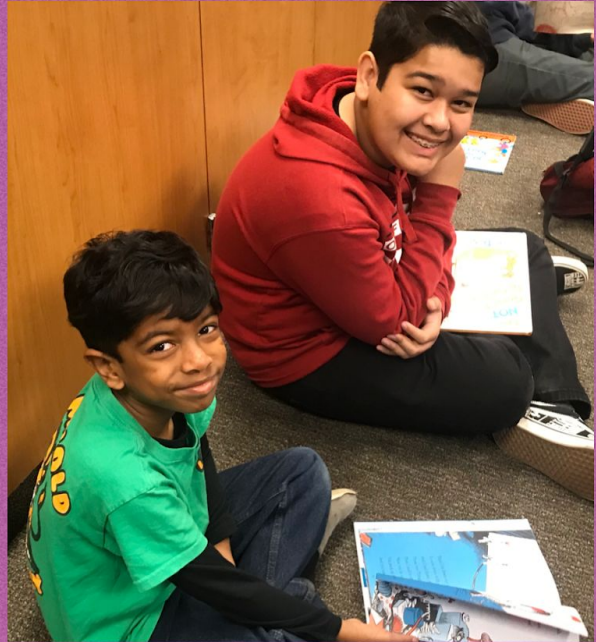


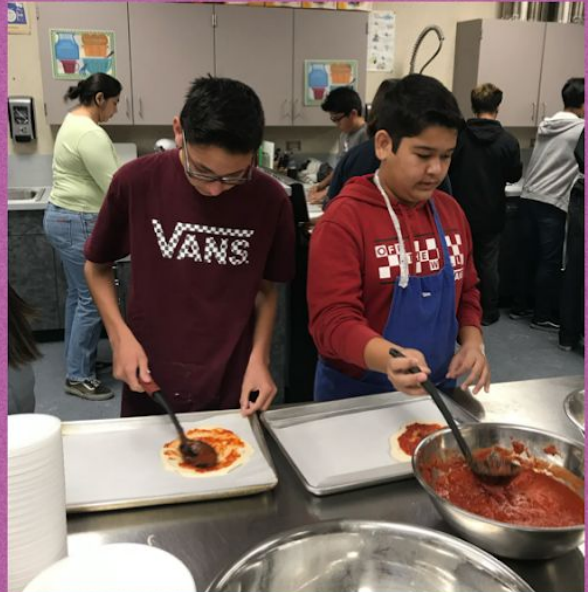
Young Living

ELPAC: English Language Proficiency Assessments for California

WHAT IS THE ELPAC?: A test that every English Learner takes every year until they are reclassified or considered proficient in English.

WHY IS IT IMPORTANT TO DO WELL ON THE ELPAC?

Once reclassified:

- students are able to take more elective classes and explore different academic pathways.
- students can have a sense of accomplishment.
- students can also gain personal and academic confidence.
- parents can see growth in their child's English reading, writing, listening and speaking skills.

Orange County Peer Court

April 08, 2020

Peer Court involves an innovative jury process through which teenage students – ages 11 to 17 – recommend sanctions for first-time juvenile offenders. About 240 minors appear before Peer Court juries each year. Members of the jury pool (participate as a juror) may earn up to two hours of community service.

Operating under the authority of the County of Orange Probation Department, Orange County judges preside over the sessions and select student juries from the audience. The jurors ask questions of the juvenile offender and parent(s), deliberate with the assistance of an attorney advisor and recommend sanctions to the Court to help get the minor back on the right track. The Judge issues the final decision on sanctions with the Probation Department supervising completion of the court-ordered sentence.

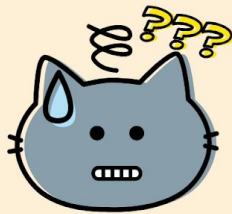

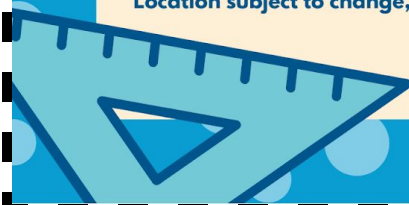

The Power of Family Engagement

What is Family Engagement?

Many educational studies show that when parents & families are involved, students tend to:

- Achieve more regardless of ethnic and/or racial background, socioeconomic status, or parent education level.
- Achieve better grades, test scores, and attendance
- Consistently complete homework
- Have better self-esteem, are more self-disciplined, and show higher aspirations and motivation towards school
- More likely to graduate and go onto higher education

How Can YOU Become Involved?

1. Provide Support and leadership through active engagement in your child's education.
2. Work collaboratively with your school's administration, teachers and your Family & Community Engagement Specialist to learn about all aspects of the school's structure and share this information with other parents.
3. Remember that together everyone achieves more. Continue to support your child's learning at home by working with their teacher's to help them develop good homework and study habits.
4. Talk with your child's teachers and school principal to learn about opportunities to get involved in your school's advisory councils as a method to make your talents, skills, and availability to assist known.

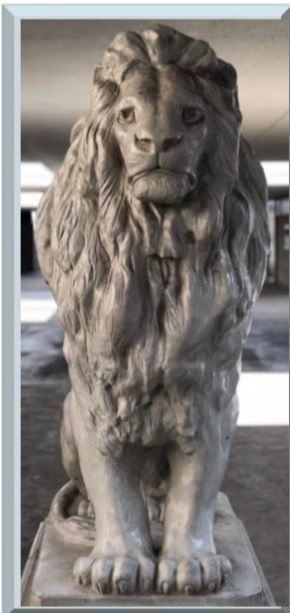
