

On Behalf of AUHSD Superintendent Matsuda:

Dear AUHSD Families,

I hope this letter finds you and your families healthy and safe. It has been over three months since we closed traditional schools and pivoted to distance learning. Shortly after we closed, the AUHSD initiated an **Opening of Schools Task Force** consisting of nearly fifty stakeholders including teachers, classified employees, association representatives, administrators, parents, and students. At a special meeting to the Board of Trustees on July 2, the committee recommended a "hybrid" model for reopening schools to the Board of Trustees which will 1) have the highest standards of safety for students and staff, and 2) ensure delivery of quality instruction to every child in the District. These are non-negotiable issues for the District and the Board of Trustees.

To compound matters, recently researchers from the UCI School of Public Health and the Orange County Health Care Agency have alerted us to an alarming spread of COVID-19 positive cases in three Anaheim zip codes. A fourth zip code with higher than average spread borders our western cities, including Buena Park, La Palma, and Cypress.

The health and safety of students and staff are paramount in our opening of school plans. To ensure adequate physical distancing of six feet at all comprehensive schools, our hybrid model will cap student physical presence in schools at no more than 33% at any one time. This will limit class size to approximately between eight and thirteen students assuring compliance with California Department of Public Health Guidelines. Additionally, at this time, it is our expectation that all staff members and students will wear face coverings at school. These two requirements (physical distancing and face coverings) are vital and will ensure that AUHSD has the highest standards of safety in the county.

For those parents who would rather enroll their student in a 100% distance learning option, please consider enrolling in our new virtual school, Cambridge Virtual Academy (see <u>auhsd.cambridge.us</u>). Due to a surge in interest, the application deadline has been extended to July 17.

The second issue I want to address is that hybrid **distance learning in AUHSD will be different than this past spring**. Parents across the state have expressed concern that their children have fallen behind academically and indeed in a recent survey of parents in the District, many parents, while appreciative of teachers' focus on the emotional well-being of students, felt that students were becoming disengaged with their educational experiences.

The District has responded to these concerns and is training our teachers in the **National Online Teaching Standards**, crosswalked to the California Standards for the Teaching Profession (CSTP), which focus on **student engagement**, **teacher presence**, **and rigorous project based learning** through the 5Cs - collaboration, creativity, communication, critical thinking, and compassion. Teachers will also be supported with on-going staff development and "learning labs" to support engagement and professional growth. Additionally, the District will repurpose aides to assist teachers in ensuring students who fall behind are identified early and communicated with. Students with mental health issues will be provided additional support through our extensive network of social workers and mental health professionals including psychologists and counselors. Fall distance learning will therefore look different than Spring instruction.

I want to assure parents and all stakeholders that not only will we have the safest schools, but also the highest standard of distance learning instruction, and that all AUHSD students will continue to be college, career, and life ready upon graduation.

On behalf of all our staff, teachers, counselors, social workers, psychologists, and administrators, it is truly a privilege and an honor to educate and mentor your children. Although these are difficult and uncertain times, and plans may change as local, state, and federal guidance evolves, I am confident that together, we will emerge a stronger community, more resilient, hopeful, and loving than ever.
