

Hello Lexington students and families,

Happy Labor Day Weekend. Hope you are getting a very needed rest. Today, I wanted to clarify some of the confusion surrounding attendance taking and provide for you a clear process and expectations. Please know that attendance is taken by teachers daily in Aeries; however, attendance policies have had to adjust due to long distance learning.

Monday, Wednesday, Friday - Synchronous days:

- Attendance is taken by teacher when students are present in class throughout the day.

Tuesday, Thursday - Asynchronous days:

Attendance taking:

- For period 2 - Students will login into the class and check-in with the teacher.
- For periods 1,3,4,5,6,7 – Each teacher will assign a daily attendance/Check-in Assignment which will be used to determine attendance. Students have until a 2:00 pm deadline to submit the check-in assignment. This check-in assignment should be simple and fast and is used strictly to mark attendance in Aeries.
 - Examples: Answering a question, a Google form, quick survey, short reflection / quick write, simple task, responding to a discussion board, etc...

Engaged Classroom Work:

- Teachers will also assign continual (engagement) classwork on Tuesday / Thursday that would reflect the time that students would normally spend in class - appx. 30-40 minutes.
 - This engagement work does not necessarily mean it is due on the same day it is assigned or by 2:00 pm that day. These assignments will differ from teacher to teacher like in a classroom and can count for a grade.
 - Examples: Independent reading, exercising, writing, working on daily journals, creating slideshows, working in groups with other students, practicing instruments / singing, watching videos or creating videos, responding to questions, solving problems, assignments provided through google forms or other docs, doing labs, ...

If you have to report an absence or notice an absence on Aeries, **please contact the attendance office**. To help support you, we will be posting a form that you can fill out under the Attendance tab on our website. This is for parents to fill out when their student has been marked absent and will be monitored and followed up by the attendance office to verify these reported absences with parents. One of the challenges we're facing right now as a result of distance learning is that we want to keep the communication line open to teachers and encourage students to reach out to the individual teachers if they are having real-time issues or concerns in their classes. This would be very similar to a student speaking with a teacher at the end of a class or prior to the beginning of a class if we were physically on a campus about a variety of class issues: Help on assignments, why they didn't submit an assignment, an absence, issues or concerns, misunderstanding of assignments, etc...

To help support students and parents, our teachers will be posting their assignments on the Schoology Course page. This way students will know what is expected and parents can help support their child and help them organize their week and day to day activities.

Case Management

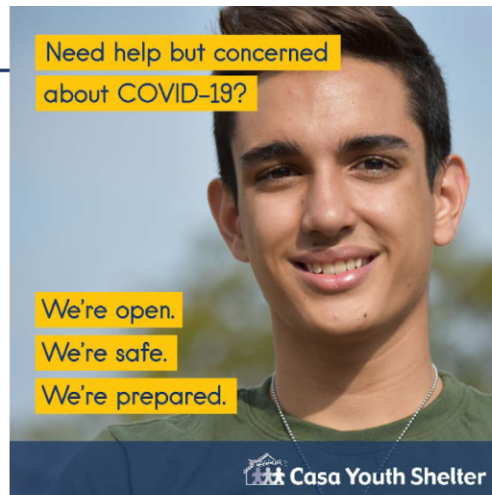
