Advanced students looked at every entry and chose two recipients for the Golden Chef's Hat: every entry was celebrated and kept the students connected while apart. While we are unable to cook together in person, Mrs. Harpst's priority is to engage and inspire Home Ec students to contribute to their household in additional ways during this challenging time. She says to parents, "It is my goal that your student will be more interested in getting into the kitchen with you, request to try a new recipe, be a more adventurous eater, offer to show off their table setting skills or take over laundry responsibilities in an effort to take a little something off your shoulders." Students have the opportunity to focus on a Career Pathways, Presentation & Communication Skills, Budget & Finance, Culinary Terms, and multiple Culinary Units. Our Exploring Home Ec curriculum covers a variety of



topics including Lessons in Laundry, Kitchen Safety & Sanitation, Equipment / Measuring, and practice with recipes. Engaging with the pictures are helping the Lexington family stay connected while being apart - so appreciated!


