


Hello Lions,

The College and Career Readiness class is designed to prepare our students for higher education by not only helping them with homework and classwork, but also student goals, monitoring, team building, and future planning in education. Mrs. Bernhard strives to help prepare students for secondary, postsecondary and career education. She says, "I love when I hear that students change their perception of math and share with me they actually like math now." For Mrs. Bernhard, connecting with students and being there for them whether it is in Math class or CCR class is her first priority. Through these unprecedented times, she tries to make school a place where her students want to be. She wants to ensure that as her


