*Some performances may call for additional costuming or props to better suit the theme of the performance. Students will be notified well in advance when specific costumes or items are needed.

Grading Policy

Grades are based on three components:

<u>Daily Class Participation—30%</u> You must be present, punctual, prepared, professional, involved, and respectful every day the choir meets in order to receive full credit. Music from many genres will be explored. Popular music will often involve movement/choreography.

You will be graded on your effort & level of participation (not ability).

Excessive tardies or absences will adversely affect grade and participation in concerts and field trips.

<u>Rehearsals/Performances—50%</u> Choir is a performance-based class. All performance obligations must be met to receive full credit. Punctuality and preparedness will affect grade. See performance schedule for a list of graded events. Parents will be notified appropriately of performances added or deleted at teacher discretion. Unexcused absences cannot be made up.

<u>Assignments/Quizzes/Tests—20%</u> Students will receive classroom assignments, projects and quizzes assessing their knowledge of musical literacy, vocal skills, lyrics, choreography, and other topics covered in class. Students will also write one paper per semester on topics such as "Reflection of a Performance" and "Lyric Analysis" which promote **critical thinking**.

Extra Credit

Students may receive extra credit at any time for attending another performance and bringing the ticket stub or program along with a one-page typed paper regarding the musical elements observed. A rubric is available in the choir room. Other extra credit may be available throughout the year.
