<u>Course Description</u>: In this class, students will study a variety of literature and focus on thinking, reading, writing, listening, and speaking skills in accordance to CA and *Common Core Standards* [http://www.cde.ca.gov/re/cc]. Coursework will focus on the AUHSD vision of the development of the 5Cs (collaboration, creativity, communication, critical thinking, and compassion/kindness). This course is designed to continue students' exposure to a variety of literary texts with adequate understanding, and to refine grammar skills and improve writing through the writing process. Genres of writing include: Narrative, Argument, Informative and Multi Genre Project. This course works to equip students to be critical thinkers and provide knowledge through observation, experience, and reflection. This course also aims to foster well informed students that actively engage in the community and find meaningful connections through learning.

**Educational Material:** Students need to have the following materials:

- ✓ Composition notebook (70+ pages)
- ✓ Package of 3x5 index cards (2nd Quarter)
- ✓ Student Planner/Binder Reminder
- ✓ Highlighters: Green, yellow, & blue

## **Homework Policy:** Written homework will be assigned an average of three days a week and is generally due at the start of class the following day. *However, reading homework will be assigned daily for 20 minutes.*

- Homework assignments will be displayed and students will be provided time at the beginning of each period to write the assignment in their own LJHS Student Planner. It is the students' responsibility to write the assignments in their planners. Parents and guardians should refer to the planner for the students' assignments and due dates.
- Only students with a verified absence will be allowed to make up missed assignments. *It is the responsibility of the student to ask for the missed assignments.* Please use the LJHS Student Planner or Study Buddies as tools to assist with absent work.
- <u>Turning in absent or make-up work</u>: You will place the assignment in the black tray labeled "ABSENT." DO NOT turn the assignment in to the regular period tray.
- Due to the high level of excellence expected in this course, if a student believes their quality of projects would benefit from additional time they may confer with the teacher 24 hours in advance of the assignment due date to request extended time for their work. The expectation will be that the student needs to come to class with the portion of the assignment he/she has completed so far and a clear vision as to what he/she hopes to achieve in the extended time. *A* student may not come empty handed, or a zero will be earned for the assignment. Also a partial assignment that is of extremely poor quality will result in a zero.
- *Late papers/assignments drop a letter grade each day they are late*. If you need extra time, make a plan with your teacher
- Cheating/Plagiarism: Cheating shall be defined as giving or receiving information on a test or submitting duplicate work for outside assignments. Using technology (e.g., computer, Internet, cell phone) to cheat or copy the work of another is prohibited. Plagiarism is a form of cheating and the penalty shall be a ZERO on the assignment.

<u>Grading Policy:</u> Grading is based on a point system. Assignments will be weighted according to the time and effort required. The overall grade is comprised of Reading (30%), Writing (30%), Speaking & Listening (30%), and Academic Practices (10%). If students have missing, incomplete, or unsatisfactory assignments they may receive an N or U for effort.
