We'll journey together to better understand ourselves and others. In this class, we will strive to challenge ourselves, expand our learning, and enjoy time together. As we move through World History, you will have the opportunity to not only discover new worlds and ideas, but experience your **Unlimited You**. How? You will develop your Unlimited You through our PBLs, Civic Engagement Work, DBQs, Discussions, and 21st Century experiences. You will also grow in the 5Cs: Character and Compassion, Communication, Collaboration, Creativity, and Critical Thinking--skills that will help you find and express your *Unlimited you*. Course Content: Welcome to 7th Grade World History. In this program, you will study the global history of the world during the period of 500-1789 AD beginning with a review of Ancient History. Students will analyze the geographic, political, economic, religious, and social structures of civilizations in Latin America, Africa, Asia, and Europe. The course will include the following as outlined in the new *California Academic and Performance Standards*.

- Vast Expansion and ultimate disintegration of the Roman Empire
- Geographic, political, economic, religious, and social structures of civilizations of Islam, China, Ghana, Mali, Japan, Europe, and Mesoamerican during the medieval ages.
- Analyze the origins, accomplishments and geographic diffusion of the Renaissance
- Analyze the historical development of the Reformation and Scientific Revolution.
- Analyze political and economic change in the 16th, 17th and 18th centuries.

We will use Document Based Questions(DBQ), Project Based Learning(PBL), presentations, etc. to assess your growth and learning. There will be an abundance of technology used in this class to further develop your 21st century skills.

Grades

- 1. Assignments/Projects are due on or before the provided deadlines and if students need more time, they need to communicate with me *before* the deadline.
- 2. Written homework will be assigned from time to time, but in general, students will only have homework if work is not completed in class. Students should be able to finish classwork in class if they are using their time wisely.
- 3. Extra credit assignments will not be provided to make up missing assignments. Students should complete the course work when it is assigned.
