Course Description: The course curriculum is designed to include the 5Cs (Communication, Collaboration, Critical Thinking, Creativity, and Character) and to introduce students to the rich history and the pursuit of inquiry-based learning. Students will be given the tools to analyze written discourse critically and creatively. In addition, this course will teach students to think broadly, read closely, and write compellingly about history. Lessons will revolve around inquiry of central questions and feature diverse sets of primary and secondary documents and text designed to teach students how to make claims that they must prove using evidence This inquiry-based approach will be challenging since students are being asked to think critically using the same processes they will be asked to perform in higher learning and in their professional lives. Thus, while challenging, students who learn this inquiry-based approach and who practice perseverance will attain the skills needed to be successful in high school and beyond.

Educational Material: Students need to have the following materials:

<u>Homework Policy:</u> Written homework will be assigned from time to time, but in general, students will only have homework if work is not completed in class. Students should be able to finish class work in class if they are using their time wisely. *However, reading homework will be assigned daily for 20 minutes.*

- Homework assignments will be displayed and students will be provided time at the beginning of each period to write the assignment in their own LJHS Student Planner. It is the students' responsibility to write the assignments in their planner. Parents and guardians should refer to the planner for the students' assignments and due dates. Assignments will also be listed on **eKadence** under the Week at a Glance.
- It is the responsibility of the student to ask for any missed assignments due to absences. Please use the LJHS Student Planner or Study Buddies as tools to assist with absent work.
- Turning in absent or make-up work: You will place the assignment in the black basket labeled "IN BOX."

This basket is located by the door.

• If the student has a missing assignment that they are sure they have turned in, they will need to check the basket labeled, "NO NAME." This basket is located in the back of the room.

- Due to the high level of excellence expected in this course, if a student believes their quality of projects would benefit from the opportunity to redo the assignment the student may discuss this opportunity with me. My goal is student success and if they know they can do better, I want to provide them the opportunity to learn and correct their mistakes.
- Students will receive full credit for any make-up work.
- Cheating/Plagiarism: Cheating shall be defined as giving or receiving information on a test or submitting duplicate work for outside assignments. Using technology (e.g., computer, Internet, cell phone) to cheat or copy the work of another is prohibited. Plagiarism is a form of cheating and the penalty shall be a ZERO until the assignment is redone after school.

Grading Policy: Grading is based on a point system. The overall grade is comprised of Reading, Writing, Listening & Speaking, and Academic Practices. If students have missing, incomplete, or unsatisfactory assignments, they may receive an N or U for effort.
