Course Description: This is the first-year course in the sequence of college preparatory courses for AUHSD students. Students will be expected to demonstrate the 5 C's: Creativity, Critical Thinking, Collaboration, Cooperation and Communication. This course will cover topics from the following standards outlined in the California Common Core Mathematics Framework. The topics include the following:

1. Proportional Relationships
2. Geometry
3. Rational Number Operation
4. Model with Expressions, Equations \& Inequalities.

Educational Materials: Students are expected to have the following material in class everyday:

Homework Policy: Homework will be assigned an average of (4 to 5 days) a week and is generally due at the start of class the following day. Each homework assignment is designed to reinforce the current day's lesson or the current unit of study. Only students with a verified absence will be allowed to make up any missing assignments. It is the responsibility of the student to ask for the missed assignments. The number of days allotted to hand in make-up work is equal to the number of days the student was verified absent from class.

Grading Policy: Students must earn a total of 120 credits and achieve a 2.0 Total GPA to promote to high school. This course will assist students in earning 10 credits toward promotion requirements.

Final grades will be determined by a weighted scale: $60 \%$ assessments/projects and $40 \%$ assignments. The grading scale is as follows: $90-100 \%=\mathrm{A}, 80-89 \%=\mathrm{B}, 70-79 \%=\mathrm{C}, 60-69 \%=\mathrm{D}, 0-59 \%=\mathrm{F}$.

One or two 100 points test will be given per chapter, quizzes will be given as needed for test practice. Students with an excused absence on a test/quiz day should expect to take the test/quiz on the day they return to school.
