

Course Description: This is a one year course for all 7th graders. The goal of this course is to introduce concepts in both physical and life science, as well as the nature of scientific method of investigation.. Throughout the course of the year using the 5 Cs, we will be covering topics that include: Scientific Investigation and Experimentation, Chemistry in the Environment, Cycles in Nature, Earth Systems and Hazards, Human Impact on the Environment as well as other topics.

Homework Policy: Homework will be assigned an average of 3-4 days a week and is due at the start of class the following day. Each homework assignment is designed to reinforce the current day's lesson or the current unit of study. **Missing or late assignments not associated with a valid absences will not be accepted.** It is the responsibility of the student to ask for the missed assignments after a valid absence. The number of days allotted to hand in make-up work is equal to the number of days the student was verified absent from class.

<u>Grading Policy</u>: Students earn a grade by accumulating points from tests, homework assignments, labs, notebooks, quizzes, and projects. Grades will be available to you through *Aeries*. Grades will typically be posted once a week. Grades are weighted: Tests / Quizzes = 40%, Labs / Projects = 20%, Homework / Classwork = 40%

Students who fail to place their name on their papers will not receive a score.

Dear Parents and Students:

Students in my classroom are always expected to behave with courtesy and considerations toward others at all times. Students who respect and follow the classroom expectations will receive positive recognition in the form of positive home contacts, weekly positive behavior drawings and eligibility for the quarterly school-wide reward events, which celebrate those students who earn all satisfactory and outstanding marks in citizenship and effort on his or her report card. One of the most important lessons we can learn in life is how to be a part of a team. This class provides the opportunity for students to live that lesson on a daily basis.

Classroom Expectations:

My fundamental expectations are that I have a right to teach and students have a right to learn. In order for that to occur the following guidelines are necessary:

- Follow all school and classroom rules and directions.
- Be in your seat and ready to learn when the tardy bell rings. (If you are standing, you are LATE!)
- Come to class with all appropriate learning materials. (Treat this like a job, not a punishment)
- Finish all foods and drink before entering the classroom. (Nobody likes to stick to their seat and anything other than water will result in a detention)
- Respect all people and property.

Students who choose not to adhere to these expectations may receive an N or U on their report card. They also jeopardize a positive learning climate for themselves and others in the class and may be subject to one or more of the following consequences:

- Loss of participation privilege in school/classroom activities.
- Detention followed by a Parent Conference.
- After School Work Detail or Saturday School.
- Class suspension followed by Referral to Administration.

*Cheating or Forgery will result in a "0" on the assignment/test, a referral and a "U" in citizenship. (Refer to pg. 8 of LJHS policy pages) If one student allows another student to copy, both students will receive zeros on the assignment and get referrals.

Students who abide by the expectations will contribute to an outstanding learning environment.
