COURSE DESCRIPTIONS

Careers, Finance, & Technology: HE9199

 Create a college, career, and life plan as they learn financial and digital literacy skills. Students will explore careers and post-secondary education and training aligned with their career choice. Explore the Career and Technical Education (CTE) pathways available and learn to use technology to support lifelong learning as well as college and career success.

Intro to Digital Art: HE9198

 Introduces students to the Elements of Art, the Principles of Design, and the rules of composition through drawing, printmaking, digital photography, digital manipulation, animation and website design. Students will be introduced to digital literacy.

I understand that I am encouraged, but not required, to take the AP Exam for any AP course I enrolled in and that financial assistance programs, for those that qualify, are in place to help subsidize the cost of the exam(s). Some HP/AP courses are offered "0" period and I may be expected to take the course "0" period if that course is offered at that time.

WORLD LANGUAGE

Embedded Dual Enrollment Program

<u>Fall semester</u>: Counseling 140 <u>Spring semester</u>: AJ 110 Intro to Criminal Justice

- Replaces 1 of your electives
- Embedded courses will show up on your schedule periods zero and first
 - You have to be on campus zero and first periods (zero period starts at 7:30AM)
 - Courses are in person at CHS with a Cypress College professor
- It's a 4 year commitment
- You can earn a graduation distinction for Dual Enrollment
