## AUHSD SCHOOL-BASED MENTAL HEALTH SERVICES

## **AUHSD School Social Worker**

**Crisis Intervention Services:** Assess and reports of child abuse, suicide, and homicide; certified ICISF mental health crisis responders for school.

**Individual counseling:** Support individual students with their social, emotional or mental health needs.

**Case Management:** Facilitate parent involvement and engagement, parent meetings, community referrals and linkage. Collaborate with community agencies.

**Group Therapy:** Facilitate evidence-based 60 minute sessions of treatment with 8-10 students once per week.
