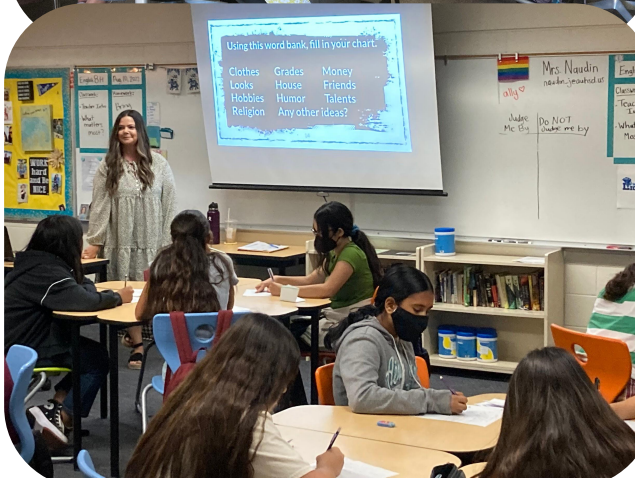

Parking Lot Rules

Yellow Curb = drop off and pick up

- Students – you must train your parents to pull all the way up to the bus stop in the morning to help alleviate traffic.

Pass-through Lane = merge to curb to drop off and pick up.

- Students – DO NOT exit or enter a vehicle in the pass-through lane
- Students exiting or entering a car in the second lane will be issued a behavior intervention

Use the Crosswalk located in front of the flag pole to reach parking stalls.
Make sure to tell your parents to pull all the way forward

CELL PHONE & ELECTRONIC DEVICES

All cell phones must be turned OFF and must NOT be visible from 8:00 AM - 2:25PM

Cell phones cannot be used during detention or in any after school classes.

If the student uses a cell phone for any reason during the restricted time, the following rules apply:

- ◆ The cell phone will be confiscated from student.
- ◆ A 60 minute after-school Behavior Intervention will be assigned.
- ◆ The cell phone will be returned only to the parent/guardian of the student.
- ◆ Lexington is not responsible for lost, damaged, or stolen phones.



DRESS CODE

Tops:

- All tops must have a sleeve which covers the shoulder completely
- No straps or cleavage can be exposed
- No strapless or low cut tops

Bottoms:

- The bottom of shorts and skirts should be below (longer than) the extended arm with clenched fist.
- Pants must fit at the waist and crotch.

Shoes:

- Must have an enclosed toe and strap covering the heel
- No slippers, No CROCS allowed

General:

- Mid-section must be covered at all times – (the test is raising hands, sitting, bending)
- No sheer, or see through clothing
- Undergarments may never be visible
- Rips in jeans cannot be above shorts length

Breakfast and Lunch

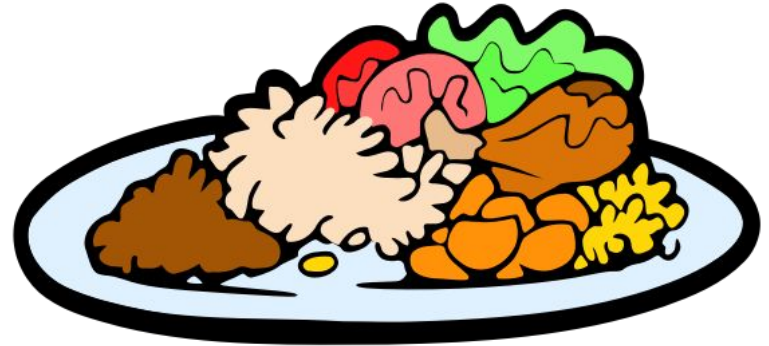
All students at AUHSD will be able to receive a breakfast and lunch daily at NO CHARGE!

- Students must have their ID, class schedule (w/ID) or enter their ID # on the pin pad when they are greeted by the cashier.

Lunch changes

- Hamburgers - on grill daily
- Pizza - 3-5 times a week
- Fresh sandwiches, wraps made daily

Chromebook Check-out

Anaheim Union High School District switched to 1-to-1 computing. As such, our school's goal is to ensure all students have some form of portable computing to have with them at all times.

- **Distribution:** Second week of school during classroom hours. *7th grade and new students only*
- **Insurance:** 30 days to purchase after student receives device



Chromebooks:

Students are responsible in safe keeping their school issued Chromebooks and bringing them fully charged to school daily.

Damage or Lost Chromebooks

- Students fill out a request form. On our district website under *Student Technology Resources*. [Student Technology Resources](#)
- Click on the large, white '?' in the blue circle.
- The student will need to sign in with their AUHSD account to submit the form. If the device has a defect not due to damage (water or physical), the TST will exchange the device for the student. If the device is damaged, the TST will levy a fee in the student's Aeries profile and exchange the device for the student.
- Insurance: Parents/students will have 30-days from the start of school to purchase insurance for \$30. Insurance covers non-warranty related issues, only one claim per year. Insurance does not cover lost/stolen devices. Insurance payment is made online at <https://schoolpay.com> or in person. Insurance may only be purchased once per year per device type.

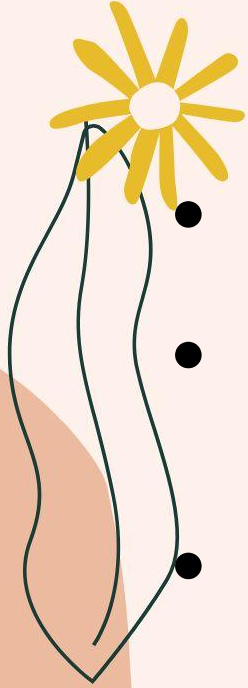

HOW WILL IT HELP STUDENTS

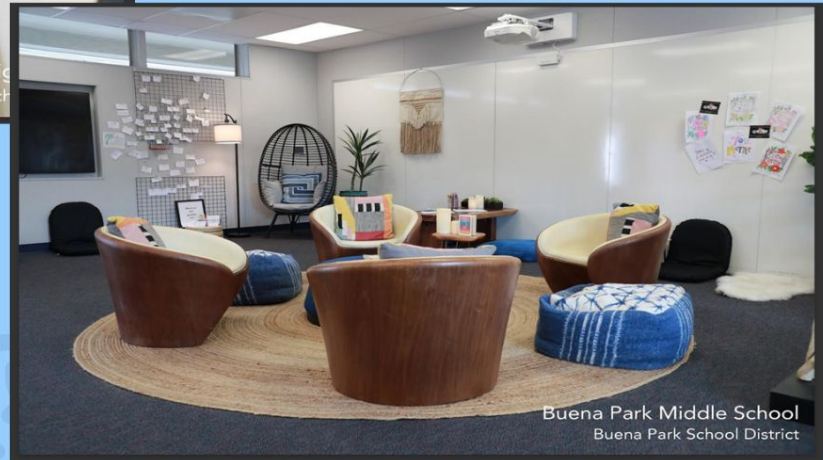

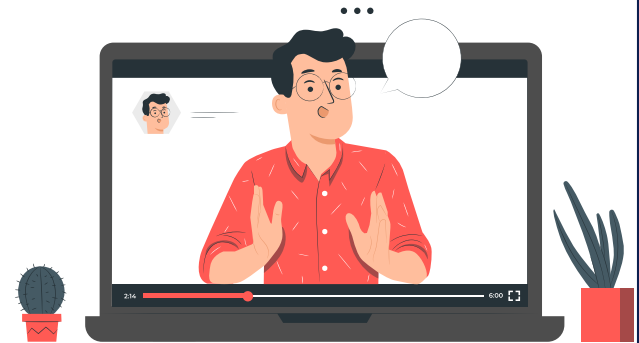

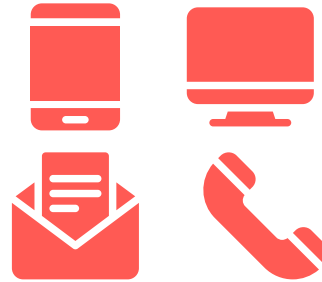
