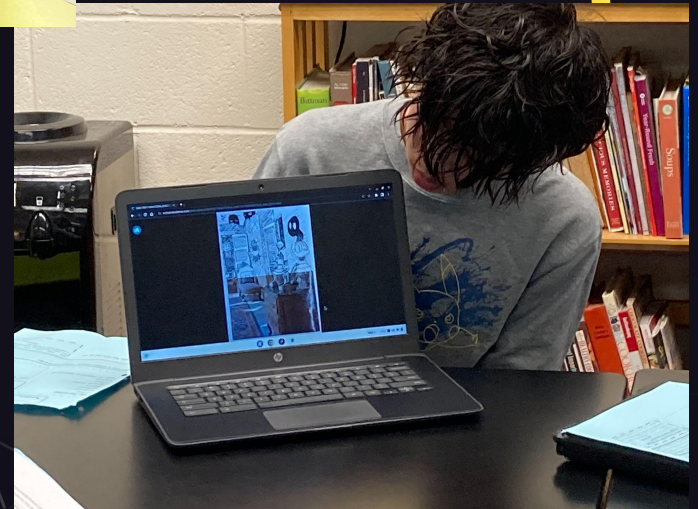
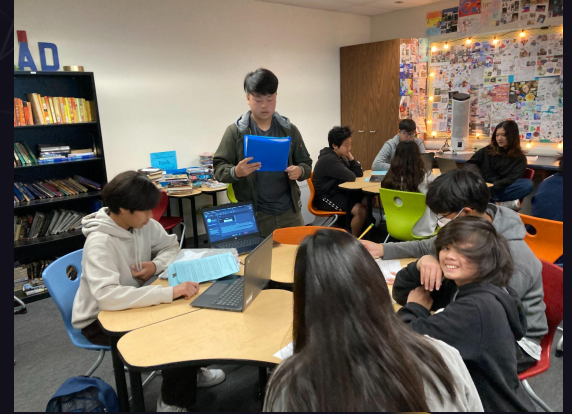
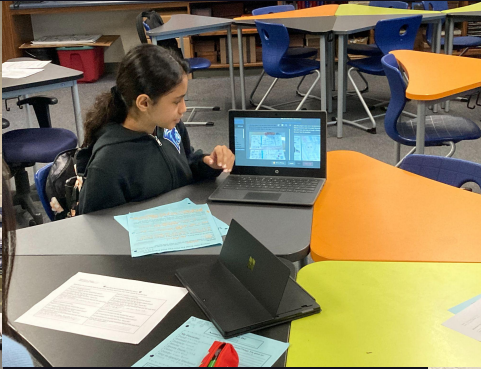
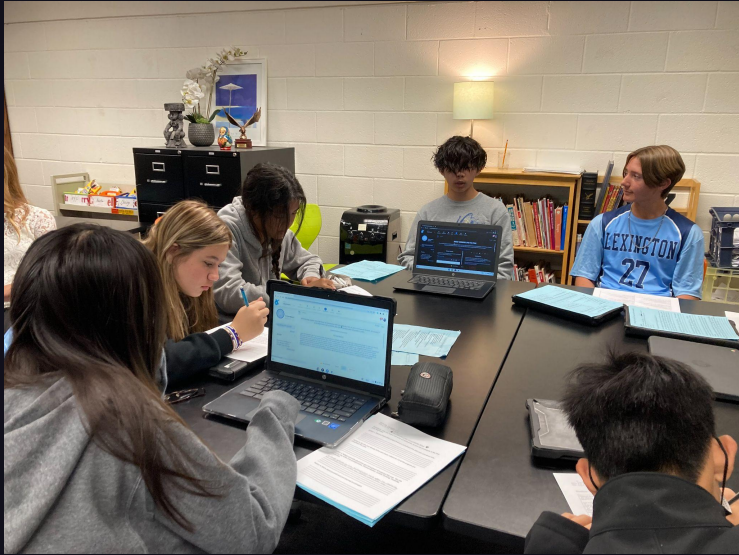
LEXINGTON CAPSTONE - Paw Print



Process

- 1.) Creating Lexington Visions: Meeting with parents, members of the community, teachers and admin to create a vision statement for Lexington that reflects Lexington's values
- 2.) Connecting our values to the CPSF
 - a.) What are the hard skills we want the students of Lexington to leave with?
 - b.) What are the soft skills (5 C's) that we want students to leave with?
 - c.) What opportunities should students have to demonstrate voice and choice in the classroom?
- 3.) Met with district leaders, teachers and admin to plan and implement how students will be demonstrating these hard skills, soft skills and student voice and choice in the classroom.
- 4.) Professional learning on creating opportunities for students to demonstrate these skills in the classroom. Elements of Performance tasks.
- 5.) Teachers choose a performance task assessment for each semester that allows students opportunities in the 5 C's, students voice and choice and the hard skills (content).
 - a.) Each student creates an artifact and completes a reflection for every PT in each class
- 6.) Students complete a PT each semester.
- 7.) Students create a portfolio on Ek and choose artifacts and reflections to include in that portfolio.
- 8.) Students showcase that portfolio and how they have grown these 2 years at Lexington.
